

# NHAI to start work on NH-8 cloverleaf near Kherki Daula

## Huda Asks Authority Not To Wait For Completion Of NPR

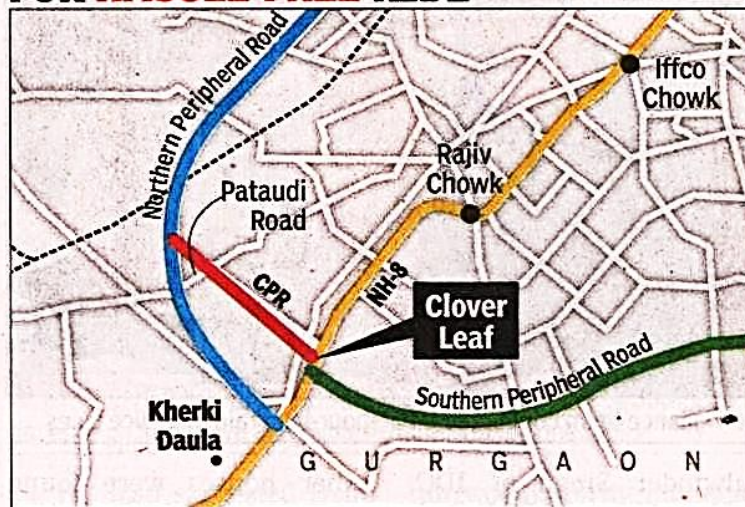

**Gurgaon:** Huda and National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) are planning to go ahead with the construction of a clover-leaf intersection on NH-8 near Kherki Daula, without waiting for the completion of northern peripheral road (NPR), also known as Dwarka expressway.

The cloverleaf intersection, to be built near Kherki Daula toll plaza, is expected to ensure hassle-free movement of vehicles from SPR to NPR, NH-8 to SPR, and vice versa.

Vehicles approaching from Faridabad and Golf Course Road have started using SPR to go towards Manesar, leading to regular traffic jams near Kherki Daula toll plaza. Considering this, Huda wrote to NHAI on

April 21 to expedite the construction of the cloverleaf.

“Hindrance on SPR has been cleared, leading to heavy traffic on the stretch near Kherki Daula toll plaza. This results

in regular traffic jams,” said Huda administrator Yashpal Yadav, adding it is necessary to give relief to traffic pressure on NH-8 by constructing the clover leaf at the intersection of

SPR and central peripheral road (CPR), which is now part of NPR, with NH-8.

Earlier, it was decided that the clover leaf would be constructed only after SPR and NPR are complete. Huda, however, has requested NHAI not to club the construction with completion of NPR. “Construction of the clover leaf should be started at the earliest,” said Yadav, adding that Huda has already completed land acquisition for the CPR part of NPR, and the clover leaf.

According to NHAI officials with the construction of the fly-over as part of the clover leaf, vehicles coming from Jaipur can directly go towards Faridabad through SPR. At present, they need to drive all the way to Iffco Chowk and take a right turn for Faridabad.
